National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS)

is a new scheme of Government of India notified on 19th August 2016. The main focus is to promote apprenticeship training in the country by incentivizing the employers who wish to engage apprentices and to fulfill the vision and mission of Skill India.

>> OBJECTIVE

• To promote apprenticeship training and to increase engagement of apprentices in the industry from present 2.3 lakhs to 50 lakhs cumulatively by 2020.

>> COMPONENTS

- Reimbursement of Stipend: Government of India will reimburse 25% of the prescribed stipend payable to apprentices per month to all employers engaging apprentices.
- Sharing of Basic Training Cost: Sharing of basic training costs with respect to fresher apprentices (who come directly for apprenticeship training without any formal training) limited to INR 7,500/- per apprentice for a maximum duration of 500 hours/3 months.

>> EASE OF ADMINISTERING THROUGH TECHNOLOGY

A user-friendly online portal (www.apprenticeship.gov.in) has been designed to facilitate easy processing of entire apprenticeship cycle.

Online registration of establishments, candidates and basic training providers.



Establishments can declare their requirements for apprentices by trade, sector, region, etc.

Establishments can also search and shortlist candidates by trade, sector, region, etc.



Apprentices can search, apply, receive and accept the offer letters from the establishments online.

Establishments can submit their documents online and returns along with their claims.



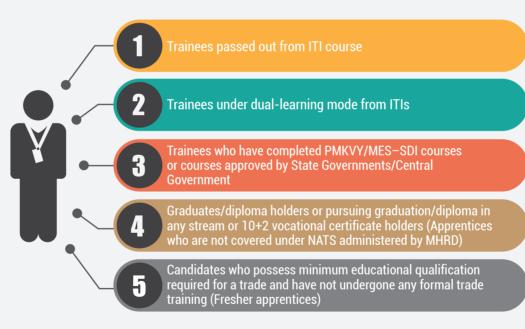
ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

>> FOR EMPLOYERS

- Employer is any person/entity who has business in any trade or
- The employers interested to avail the benefits of the scheme must fulfill the following:
- Employer shall engage apprentices in a band of 2.5% to 10% of the total strength of the establishment.
- o Employers must have EPFO/ESIC/Factory/Cooperative/MSME registration number.
- Employers must have TIN/TAN number.
- Employers must register on the apprenticeship portal.
- Employers must have an Aadhaar linked bank account.

>> FOR APPRENTICES

- An apprentice is a person who has made a contract of apprenticeship with the employer for apprenticeship training under the Apprentices Act, 1961.
- Apprentices can be engaged from the following five categories:



- Apprentice must fulfill the following:
- o He/she has completed 14 years of age and fulfills other requirements of the Apprentices Act, 1961.
- Every apprentice has to register on the portal.
- o Every apprentice must have an Aadhaar number.
- o Must possess minimum age, educational and physical qualification prescribed for the trade.

>> FOR BASIC TRAINING PROVIDERS

- Basic Training Provider (BTP) is an entity who has the facilities for imparting basic training to apprentices.
- Types of BTPs:
- Government & Private Industrial Training Institutes.
- Industries/establishments with in-house basic training facilities.
- BTP set up/supported by Industry clusters
- BTPs interested to avail the benefits of the scheme must. fulfill the following:
- They can get registered only after RDAT approval.
- BTP must be registered on the apprenticeship portal.
- o BTP must have an Aadhaar linked bank account.

>> IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES

Regional Directorates of Apprenticeship Training (RDATs) and State Apprenticeship Advisors are the implementing agencies for their respective regions.
